## Township Manager

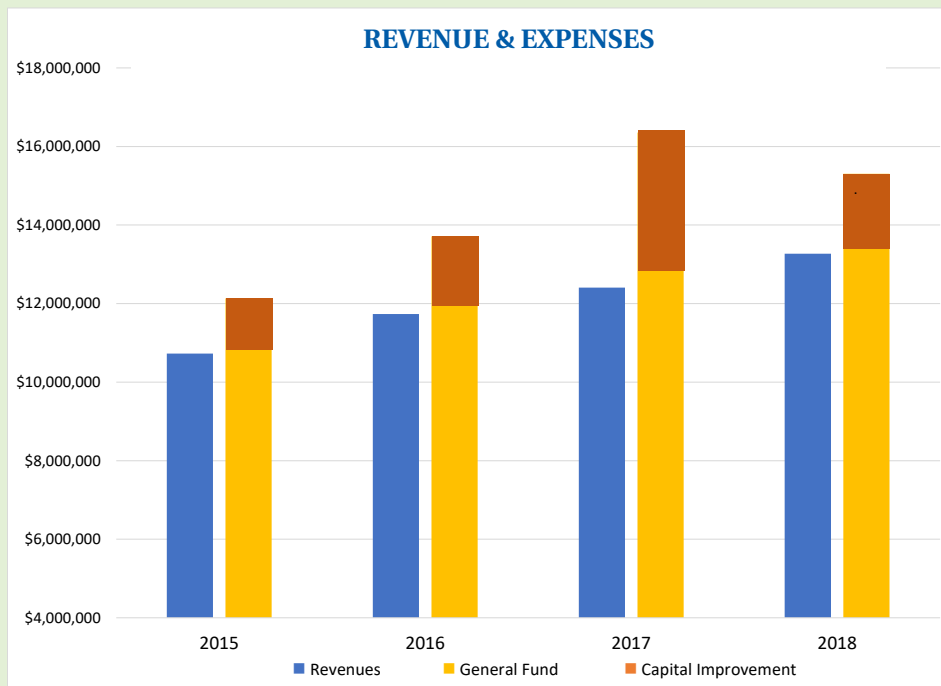
### “Our 2018 Budget – Continuing the Path to Sustainability”

On December 13, 2017, the Silver Spring Township Board of Supervisors approved the 2018 Budget. The major goal of this budget is to continue to provide exceptional public services, drive efficiency in administrative processes and continue to invest in infrastructure improvements. On behalf of the Silver Spring Township Board of Supervisors, I am able to report that the mission was a success, and was completed without the need for a tax increase. Please see the website for more details on the 2018 Budget.

The 2018 General Fund budget is \$13.2 million, which represents a 7.0 percent increase over last year and our Capital Improvement Fund budget is \$2,033,000. Growth, continued infrastructure work, rising health care costs and unfunded federal mandates have had an impact on our budget. We will initiate projects that help the Township drive efficiency and reduce costs. The Township purchased a new financial system that will streamline all transactions and help manage the community’s growth.

In addition, the Township will undergo a major revision to its Comprehensive Plan. The Comprehensive Plan will guide the community’s vision and goals for the future, with the outcome guiding public policy in terms of transportation, utilities, land use, recreation, and preservation. Both the software and comprehensive plan initiatives are funded, in part by grants from the Department of Community & Economic Development.

# PUBLIC WORKS

## ***Penn Waste - New Trash Carts***

- **Why did I get the cart that I did?** Carts were delivered based on your current level of service level for either regular or low volume.
- **Do I have to use the cart provided?** Regular volume customers may choose between using their existing trash receptacle OR the larger 96-gallon cart provided by Penn Waste. Low volume customers are required to use the smaller, 35-gallon carts.
- **What if I have a bulk item or excess waste that will not fit in the smaller 35-gallon cart?** Orange collection bags can be purchased from the Township office (8 Flowers Drive, Mechanicsburg) during our regular business (M-F, 8am to 4pm) for \$5 each.
- **Can unused bags be returned for a refund?** Yes, you can return unused orange bags to at Township, and Penn Waste will note a credit on your billing statement.
- **Can I switch my service level?** Yes, call Penn Waste at (717) 767-4456 and they will be happy to help.
- **How do I discard my old trash can?** Place your can at the curb on your regular pickup day with a note that reads "PLEASE TAKE" and Penn Waste will do the rest.

We remind all residents to please place carts at least 3 feet apart from each other and mailboxes, fire hydrants, low hanging trees or shrubs, parked cars, or utility poles so trucks can easily access them. ## ***Snow Routes***

Routes for the 2017-18 snow season will be published on the Township website. Residents without computer access are invited to call the Township at (717) 766-0178 for information. Please note:

- Silver Spring Township maintains approximately 93 miles of roadway, which can take up to 8 hours to clear during a typical 2-4" snowfall event.
- In cases of severe weather, major roads are plowed first, followed by secondary and local roads, and lastly, developments.
- Residents are encouraged to use off street parking during snow events to allow for plow access to the roadways.

## ***Yard Damage***

- Plow routes are inspected within 72 hours of snow removal activities, at which point the Township takes note of any damage to yards/sod.
- Sod left in paved areas will be removed within 96 hours of snow removal activities; damaged yard areas will be addressed in the spring.
- Residents living on streets without curbs are asked to place reflective markers along the edge of their lawns to help prevent plow damage.

# EMA SPOTLIGHT

## Learn from Every Storm

- Restock your emergency supplies to be ready in case another storm hits. It is recommended that you keep at least a 3-day supply on hand.
- Assess how well your supplies and family plan worked. What could you have done better?
- If possible, check in on your elderly neighbors as they may not have access to the same information and resources.

## Carbon Monoxide Poisoning

Snowdrifts and power outages are a recipe for carbon monoxide poisoning. You cannot see, smell, or taste the gas. Carbon monoxide poisoning symptoms include headache, dizziness, weakness, nausea, vomiting, chest pain, and confusion. If everyone in your home has these symptoms at the same time, it most likely is not the flu. Get out as quickly as possible and call 911.



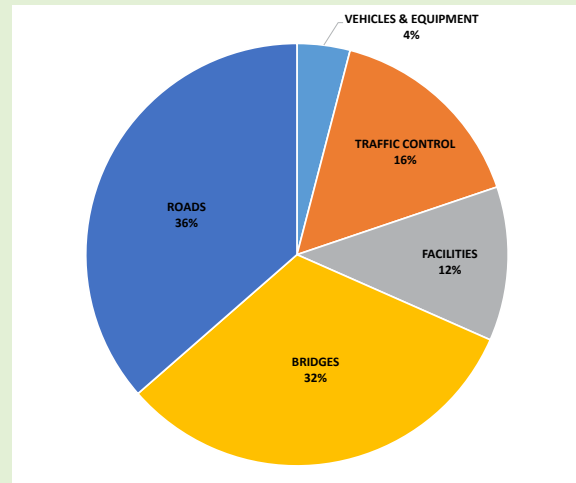
When snow blows against the house it can block vents. Keep vents and flues free of snow and debris, especially if winds are high.

- Never run a generator or any gasoline-powered engine inside a basement, garage, or other enclosed structure, even if the doors or windows are open, unless the equipment is professionally installed and vented.
- Never use a charcoal grill, hibachi, lantern, or portable camping stove inside a home, tent, or camper.
- If conditions are too cold, seek shelter with family, friends or at a public shelter.
- Clean gas dryer vents.

Funds collected through the Earned Income Tax (EIT) represent the Township's greatest source of revenue; at \$2.7 million. The EIT represents 30 percent of the total revenue. Real Estate (RE) Tax collected by the tax collector, is based on 2010 assessed property values, and provides our second largest revenue source. The Township mill rate is 1.3045 and is divided between the Township and our two volunteer fire companies, with the Township portion at .659 mills and representing \$1.5 million in revenue.

## CAPITAL FUND EXPENSES



Silver Spring Township continues to top the charts in growth in the Commonwealth. It is estimated that the Township's growth in the past five years has increased by nearly 20 percent. The focus has and will continue to be public safety and community improvements. The Township will invest \$500,000 in roadway improvements in 2018. Other major projects in 2018 include over \$850,000 to be spent on the repair/replacement of Mulberry Drive and Beechcliff Drive bridges, and designs for two new traffic signals.

In other news, the Board of Supervisors has decided that it will be meeting once per month, beginning on January 24<sup>th</sup>. Meetings are tentatively scheduled for the 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday of each month at 6:30pm and are held at the Township Administration Building, located at 8 Flowers Drive in Mechanicsburg. The Board would also like to announce that Harry Kotzmoyer and Donald Sokolowski will be joining Nancy Konhaus Griffie, Carl Machamer and David Lenker, II (see page 2). With that, we offer a note of appreciation to Robert Seader and Georgianne Diener who served on the Board while the positions were open. Supervisors Diener and Seader brought a great deal of experience, dedication and guidance to the Board during their terms. We are grateful for their service and dedication to the Township.

# COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

## **Comprehensive Plan**

Save yourself from the winter doldrums now that the holidays are over. Get involved! Researchers have found that social networks and community involvement have positive health consequences. Persons who are actively involved in their community tend to live longer and be healthier physically and mentally. Social and community ties are key components of Social Capital, defined as the social networks and interactions that inspire trust and reciprocity among citizens. Individuals with high levels of social capital tend to be involved politically, to volunteer in their communities, and to get together more frequently with friends and neighbors. They are also more likely to trust or to think kindly of others. Social capital has been found to be linked to more than just good health. The proper functioning of democracy, the prevention of crime, and economic development are also enhanced<sup>1</sup>.

Pennsylvania recommends its municipalities update their Comprehensive Plan every 10 years to ensure everyone; citizens, developers, conservationists, neighboring municipalities, the County, and others are on the same page. We encourage our residents and business owners to participate in this process. ## **Traffic Impact Fee (TIF) Approved**

Silver Spring continues to be among the fastest growing Townships in the Commonwealth. This growth brings with it the need to upgrade and expand the Townships existing infrastructure. Tax funds have traditionally been used to fund the planning, implementation and maintenance of these improvements. At the December 13, 2017 Township meeting, however, the Board of Supervisors approved a new ordinance (2017-14), requiring commercial, industrial, and residential developers to contribute toward the expense. The newly established TIF is based on the increased traffic generated by new development and is the result of a significant amount of research and forecasting performed over the course of the last year and a half.

## **Do I need a Permit?**

Did you know that a building permit and inspection are required when installing an awning that will extend more than 54 inches off an exterior wall?

Awnings add additional weight load and can be a safety hazard if the wall cannot support

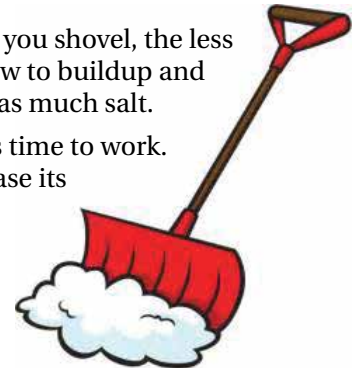
the weight or if not properly installed. We ask that you please contact the Township at (717) 591-9067, ext. 3321 if you are considering the installation of an awning or have questions as to whether a permit and inspection are required in your situation.



## **Stormwater/MS4 Update Stay Smart this Winter**

As the winter weather approaches, keep in mind that salt and other materials we use to melt ice and provide traction can runoff into our waterways and contribute to stormwater runoff pollution. Here are a few winter stormwater tips:

- Shovel early! The sooner you shovel, the less likely it is for ice and snow to buildup and you will not need to use as much salt.
- Don't over salt! Salt takes time to work. Extra salt does not increase its effectiveness.
- Read the bag! Certain de-icers/salts have less environmental impact. Look for eco-friendly products that contain acetate, potassium chloride or magnesium chloride. Avoid products containing sodium chloride and calcium chloride which are more harmful to vegetation, wildlife and pets.
- Check the temperature! Many de-icers don't work in temperatures below 15 degrees Fahrenheit.
- Cracked Corn can be an effective and more environmentally friendly traction agent. Sand and kitty litter may work but can clog storm drains and contribute to runoff pollution.
- Sweep up excess salt and traction agents before they runoff into our streams.

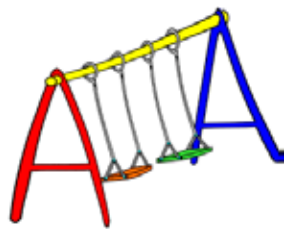

## Seasonal Park Access

Don't let colder temperatures stop you from enjoying a day in the park. Township parks are the perfect place to enjoy some time in the great outdoors. Take the family sledding, snow shoeing, or maybe even cross-country skiing. Many of the indoor facilities at the parks will be closed to avoid freezing pipes, but portable restrooms are available, with the exception of Paul Walters Memorial Park. The Public Works department will often plow small sections of the parking lot at some of our parks, once the Township roads have been cleared. Sidewalks and trails are not cleared, but this shouldn't stop you from getting out and having some fun. We ask that you preserve our open areas by making every effort to stay on the trails provided. Please do NOT drive through unplowed areas.



## Paul Walters Memorial Park



Construction will continue in the spring on the 34-acres of undeveloped parkland acquired by the Township in 2005. Improvements include new landscaping, a playground with swings, benches and picnic tables, sidewalks, and additional

parking. We hope to have the new facilities open in late summer (weather permitting). This project was funded in part by a \$350,000 grant through DCNR, with grading & site excavation provided by Charter Homes. ## Dogs Allowed in Parks

The Township Board of Supervisors voted unanimously to approve updates to Ordinance 2008-04, which governs the rules and regulations for use of the Township parks. The new ordinance (2017-11) allows for the acceptance of dogs in all parks, with the following restrictions:

- Dogs must be kept under control and on a leash, that is no longer than 6 feet.
- Dogs are not permitted on athletic fields or play grounds.

Owners are required to clean-up after their dogs. The success of this change is dependent upon dog owners being responsible for their pets. ## Huston Mill Renovations

Stabilization of the Huston Mill, conveniently located at the corner of Willow Mill Park Road, along the Conodoguinet Creek is now complete. Phase I of the project

included the rebuilding of several exterior stone walls, new windows and doors, upper level flooring and a new roof. Funding for these improvements was provided through the collection of over \$270k in private donations by the Friends of Willow Mill, a non-profit organization, which was then matched through the use of various grants. Additional donations are needed toward utilities, interior framing, flooring and other finishes, in order to make the building fully functional.
