### MESSAGE FROM THE Township Manager

Silver Spring Township is ON THE MOVE with the distinction of being the *second fastest growing township in the Commonwealth from 2010 to 2017*. US Census Bureau data indicates that we have grown by more than 3,300 residents in the last six years, an increase of nearly 30%. Even if you have not lived in the Township for very long, you have experienced the impact this growth brings, with new businesses, new developments, new roads, and bridges. We recognize the need to continue to examine how we manage the growth in order to continue to provide the level of service our residents expect.

The Board of Supervisors commissioned Environmental Planning and Design (EPD) to revise our current Comprehensive Plan last year, with the goal of giving staff the tools they need to help ensure that our growth continues in a healthy and responsible manner. EPD has completed similar revisions for our neighboring communities, including Derry Township, Lancaster and Marietta. The Comprehensive Planning Steering Committee was established to work closely with EPD and has met 9 times. The Township also held 3 public meetings in order to gain input from you, our residents, and local business owners. Our thanks to those members and residents for the time given to assist with the plan.

Phase 2 of the Comprehensive Plan includes a series of proposed actions for implementation, which will be posted on the Township's website at [www.sstwp.org](http://www.sstwp.org). We encourage everyone to take some time to review this information and provide your feedback. The input received will be considered as part of the final Comprehensive Plan, which we expect to have completed by the end of the year.



You are what makes Silver Spring Township a beautiful place to live, work, and play. We look forward to implementing the recommendations received, and to increasing the vitality and livability of our community. Remember to visit our website for information in regard to meeting dates, schedule changes, etcetera.

## Your Tax Dollars at Work

Silver Spring Township is looking forward to the completion of some major infrastructure projects in 2018, including the replacement of the Mulberry Drive bridge and repairs to the one on Beechcliff Drive. We also have some general roadwork maintenance going on throughout the Township to include miscellaneous patching, crack sealing, shoulder work, and drainage repairs. Bridge work alone is expected to total \$811,000, with an additional \$210,000 in general maintenance costs.



We will also be making improvements to several of our roadway signals, including battery backups, generators and LED upgrades, with funds provided by a \$160k grant through the Green Light Go program.

Be on the lookout out for our maintenance crews as they will be **trimming trees** within the road right-of-way throughout the Township beginning in late September. We remind you to please avoid placing **grass clippings** and other yard waste on roadways and gutters. Accumulated grass clippings and other yard waste impede proper roadway drainage and can clog storm water inlets creating flooding.

Our annual **street sweeping** initiative began in May and will continue through the third week of July. We ask that you please clear the street of vehicles, and potential impediments (basketball hoops, etc.) to allow for an efficient operation. ## Recycling Crisis




For decades, China has used recyclables from around the world to supply its manufacturing boom. The U.S. exports about one-third of its recycling, and nearly half of that goes to China.

China recently declared that foreign recycling includes too many other non-recyclable materials that are dirty, or even hazardous, and has listed 24 kinds of solid wastes it plans to ban in order to protect China's environmental interests and people's health.

Part of the crackdown has to do with what the industry calls "wishful recycling," hoping whatever goes in the bin can be used again. You can help by making sure you are putting the right stuff in the recycling cart. Bottle caps, plastic bags, and pizza boxes are the most common no-nos. # SEPTIC SYSTEM MAINTENANCE

While it may cost upwards of \$300 to pump a tank, that is far less than the \$20,000 to \$25,000 it costs to replace a failed system. The following are 4 simple ways you can help preserve your septic system, and keep it operating smoothly for years to come.



- 1. Use Water Efficiently.** Allowing too much water to cycle through your septic system too quickly can impede its ability to treat waste and may flood your drain field. A single leak or running toilet can waste as much as 200 gallons of water per day.
  - Consider replacing older model toilets with newer HIGH EFFICIENCY units
  - FAUCET AERATORS, high-efficiency showerheads, and shower flow restrictors help reduce the volume of water entering your septic system
  - Clothes washers that bear the ENERGY STAR® label use 35% less energy and 50% less water than standard models

**2. Toilets are not Trash Cans.** NEVER flush cooking grease or oil, flushable wipes, personal hygiene products, dental floss, diapers, cigarette butts, coffee grounds, cat litter, paper towels, pharmaceuticals, or household chemicals.

**3. Think at the Sink.** Pouring toxins down your drain can kill organisms necessary in digesting and treating household waste

- Avoid chemical drain openers for a clogged drain; use boiling water or a drain snake instead
- NEVER pour cooking oil or grease down your drain
- NO oil-based paints, solvents, or large volumes of toxic cleaners down the drain
- Eliminate or limit the use of a garbage disposal to REDUCE the amount of fats, grease, and solids that can clog the drain field

**4. Maintain your Drain field**

- Never park or drive on your drain field
- Plant trees the appropriate distance to keep roots from growing into your septic system
- Keep roof drains, sump pumps, and other rainwater drainage systems away from your drain field area

We hear you! A new ordinance has been enacted regarding door to door solicitations and peddling in the Township. Salespeople are required to obtain a permit through the Silver Spring Township Police Department and must present it for view when asked. The new ordinance prohibits solicitation between the hours of 5pm and 9am, Monday through Friday, and on Sundays. Residents who do not want to receive solicitations are welcome to post no solicitation signage. Exceptions to the no solicitation rule include political and various non-profit groups (schools, churches, etc.). Please see Ordinance No. 2018-05 on our website for more information.

## EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY (EMA)

Upwards of 7,000 Americans are injured each year while using backyard barbecue grills. The following are some hints and tips to help you stay safe when grilling outdoors!

### Always

- Keep your grill at least 10 feet away from your house
- Clean your grill regularly
- Check for gas leaks
- Keep decorations away from your grill
- Keep a spray bottle of water handy
- Keep a fire extinguisher within a couple steps of your grill, and KNOW HOW TO USE IT



### Never

- Turn on the gas while your grill lid is closed
- Leave a grill unattended
- Overload your grill with food
- Use a grill indoors

# COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

## ***Comprehensive Plan Update***

In the past 20 years, growth pressure, traffic increases, greater demand for public services, and increased pressure on sensitive resources have made changes to the Township's traditional rural landscape. These changes are of clear concern to the Township whose overarching goal is to retain its traditional rural character and quality of life for its residents while still addressing and responding to inevitable change. The Township recognizes a balance is needed between meeting changing demands and the ability of the land to sustain development and new uses. Through the revision to the Comprehensive Plan, the Township seeks to establish principles on which planning decisions are based on environmentally sound and sustainable principles, infrastructure capabilities, and the need to meet legal requirements.

Since the last newsletter, the Comprehensive Plan Steering Committee has identified essential recommendations that will serve as guidelines for directing future growth and development, community services, infrastructure, resource protection, and energy conservation in the Township, and provide a framework for implementing the plan strategies.

The planning recommendations identify the strategies for achieving the Township's vision for the future. The plan is scheduled to be available for public review later this month. All public comments will be considered in developing the final Comprehensive Plan.

## ***Stormwater Update***



Silver Spring Township has developed a Chesapeake Bay Pollutant Reduction Plan as required by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection as part of our MS4 permit renewal. Our goal is to reduce sediment, nitrogen and phosphorus pollutant loadings in our waterways by 10% over the

next 5 years. As part of this plan, we have proposed a series of projects throughout the Township, the majority of which have one thing in common; planting trees!

No matter where you live, work, or play, trees are a vital part of your quality of life. They supply oxygen, filter our air and water, reduce flooding, provide recreation,

increase property values, and more. Trees help to manage stormwater runoff and reduce erosion by intercepting falling rain; their roots aid in stabilizing the soil along streambanks, and promote ground water infiltration.

The Township recently took part in the Chesapeake Bay Foundation's 10 million trees initiative by planting 200 native trees at Hidden Creek Park, with help from the Conodoguinet Creek Watershed Association. These new trees will help strengthen the forested buffer along the creek, and assist in filtering out stormwater pollutants and sediment.

You can get involved in helping the Township meet its pollutant reduction goals by planting trees on your property, especially if you live along a stream. Another option would be to volunteer at a local tree planting event. ## ***Do I need a Permit?***

Most home improvement projects require a Zoning Permit prior to construction, and some may also require a Building Permit.

Fences, sheds, ponds and patios all require a Zoning Permit; decks, detached garages, and patio roofs require both. Permits however are not required to replace roof shingles or to plant trees, shrubs, or gardens.

It is suggested that you review your deed for the presence of stormwater easements, prior to submitting a permit application. Stormwater easements allow the flow of stormwater or access to buried sanitary or storm piping in the case of emergency. Improvements such as fences, pools, decks, and gardens are not permitted within these easement areas.

Requirements in regard to setbacks, height, impervious coverage regulations, etc. can be found within the Township's Zoning Ordinance, available on our website at [www.sstwp.org](http://www.sstwp.org).



## Swimming Pools

Swimming pools and spas are great places for family fun. Make sure everyone follows these simple safety steps to stay safer in and around the water.

- Know how to perform CPR on children and adults
- Remain vigilant during activities in or around the pool/spa
- Never leave a child unattended in or near water
- Teach children how to swim
- Teach children to stay away from drains

Install proper barriers, covers and alarms on and around your pool and spa



If you have a pool, or are thinking of putting one in, please note:

- A permit is required for ALL pools greater than 2-feet deep
- Pool fences/gates are a MUST, and shall be at least 48" high
- Gates must be self-closing, self-latching and open away from the pool; locking mechanisms shall be located no less than 54" from the bottom of the gate
- Residential doors with direct access to the pool area must be equipped with an alarm which produces an audible warning sound



## SAT Prep Course Fee Correction

We apologize for a misprint in the last Parks & Rec Guide. We incorrectly noted that there was a non-resident fee, however, non-resident fees are not applicable for the SAT Prep program. The standard rate for all students is \$180 for a single subject (English or Math) or \$315 for both English and Math. The course is taught by current CV teachers and is geared towards high school students. You must register with the Guidance Department to take the actual test. The course runs for 6 weeks, with 1 additional week in case make-up classes are necessary due to weather or facility changes. The next session begins on September 18, 2018 and is held on Tuesdays (English - Room 274, CVHS) & Thursdays (Math - Room 248, CVHS), from 6:15 PM to 8:15 PM on both nights.

## Tax Corner

Township Tax Collector, Debra Basehore Wiest, would like to remind residents that School Real Estate bills were mailed on July 1. Please call (717) 697-1294 if you did not receive your bill. If your taxes are paid by your mortgage company, you should forward a copy of the bill to them. The end of the discount period for school taxes is August 31 (postmark acceptable) and December 17 is the deadline if paying 2018 taxes by personal check.



## Land Preservation Review Board (LPRB)

Are landowners who have preserved their property through the Silver Spring Township Land Preservation program at risk for eminent domain seizures? While it is true that all land, may be subject to eminent domain proceedings, land preserved through the Township's LPRB process receives additional protections that others do not.

Land in the Township is preserved through the use of a conservation easement, which lists Natural Lands Trust as the primary easement holder, and Silver Spring Township as a secondary easement holder. This gives the Township legal standing to oppose any eminent domain actions. In a recent statement, the Board of Supervisors have stated that anyone seeking to use the eminent domain statute on one of our preserved properties would not be permitted to do so without their consent.

Finally, those properties that are eligible (farms primarily) can enroll in the local Agricultural Security Area (ASA). Once enrolled, any condemnation actions brought against these parcels must also go through the Agricultural Land Condemnation Approval Board, adding a third level of protection. All this makes preserving your land through the Township program a wise decision.
